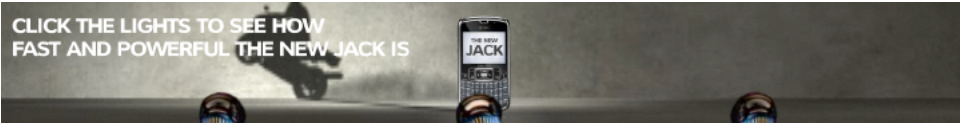

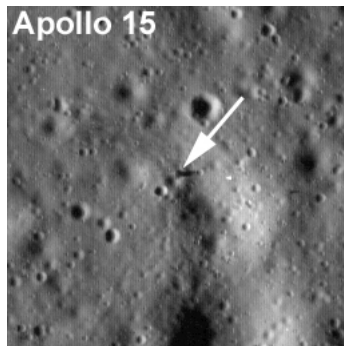
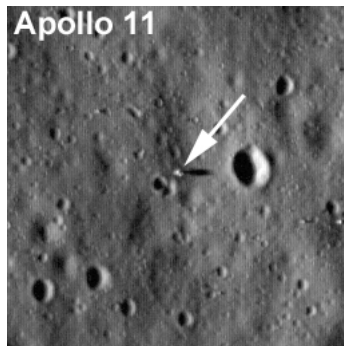

New photos of Apollo debris on the moon

One of NASA's newest missions to the moon has [captured images](#) from its most famous landings, the space agency reported Friday.

The Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter (LRO) captured pictures of five [Apollo missions'](#) lunar module descent stages sitting on the moon's surface. The spacecraft, which reached lunar orbit on June 23, should see Apollo 12, the only one not yet photographed, in the next two weeks.

"Not only do these images reveal the great accomplishments of Apollo, they also show us that lunar exploration continues," said Richard Vondrak of NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center, in a statement. "They demonstrate how LRO will be used to identify the best destinations for the next journeys to the moon."

Each Apollo descent deck left behind in the landings measures about 12 feet across. In the future, the orbiter should take images of the landing sites with a doubled or tripled resolution of the just-released pictures.
